### The Shipwrecked SS Laristan and the kindness of the Oban Red Cross – 1942

On the 15th of September 1942, the SS Laristan, travelling from Liverpool as part of a convoy, ran into serious difficulty off the shores of Tiree, and eventually ran aground upon the rocks at Craignish. The crew aboard the vessel all appear to have survived the marooning and were rescued by a number of the islanders. The crew were taken back to the mainland, where they docked in Oban and were met by representatives from the British Red Cross. The members, headed by Lady MacDougall, gifted the men warm clothes and various comforts, displaying the hospitality of Oban people. The generosity of the townsfolk made a significant impact, as Lady MacDougall received a multitude of letters from various members of the crew and several grateful wives.
